### "From the Eagle's Nest"-(Updates from the Principal/School Board)

As part of our commitment to transparency and collaboration, the principal and school board will be sharing weekly/monthly updates with families. These updates will highlight new and upcoming changes, dialogues currently taking place, considerations under review, and any concerns being addressed. Our goal is to bridge communication between school leadership and our families so that we can work together with unity and understanding. By keeping you informed, we hope to build trust, invite healthy dialogue, and ensure that every step forward is guided by our shared mission to nurture students in Christ-centered excellence.

- 1. In October we are going to continue to review and evaluate our current newly added enrollment policy. Right now 4 of our 10 classes are within 1-4 students of the cap for their class (24 for grades 1-8 and 20 for grades 4K-5K). This will be an ongoing process before the finalization of the handbook in the spring of 2026.
- 2. We are currently in the process of our 2025-2026 accreditation process. Committees are formed and working hard to achieve NLSA accreditation for our school review in April, 2026. We are excited to share the great things we are doing here at SJLM.
- 3. Security updates are continually under review and assessed in collaboration with our local police department, sheriff's office, fire department, and EMT services. In the next few weeks, Paladin Technologies will be on site to add cameras to our perimeter, our school gym, and update our key fob system for both lobby doors. They will also be working to add a camera (on a light post) to oversee the playground as well. Furthermore, we are adding two new locked sets of keys for the sheriff's office in case of an emergency and quick response. Lastly, we are evaluating the cost and timeline to install shatter-resistant window film to windows on our facility. This film is almost unrecognizable to the naked eye and won't even be noticed by the kids!
- 4. We are continuing our search for a full-time/part-time band director for 2025-2026. We are loving our collaboration with Anne Widener from Martin Luther High School, but we have aspirations to house our very own band program/parish of music director for our church and school. If anyone has leads as we get into the school year, feel free to reach out.
- 5. Our school board has initiated a process to reevaluate and initiate an extensive strategic plan for our ministry in regards to 6 pillars: student services, faculty/staff services, growth and development, facilities, and partnerships. Our goal is to align all future tasks for our ministry to point back to our school mission, vision, and guiding values. We are very excited to continue praising God for the blessings we already have here at SJLM, but also, looking ahead to future years of success, growth, and ministry.
- 6. The school board and principal are going to be tasked with reevaluating how we fundraise/communicate for larger functions that take place in 7-8th grade (Outdoor Ed, 8th grade trip, etc.). We have many newer families that we want to ensure are aware of these amazing opportunities, but also, to have ample time to prepare for them in a timely fashion (schedules and financially).

While we could go on about all the amazing things taking place, we pray these glimpses give an insight into the many major items under consideration or current projects. We are excited to continually make improvements to glorify God and provide the very best for our students, families, and staff.



### **Classroom News**

**5th Grade Class-** We are getting into our new routine. Make sure you are checking Skyward for missing assignments and using the planner to do your homework. Spelling and handwriting is always due on Fridays.

**6th Grade Class -** Week 3 of 6th grade is in the books! Thanks for all the newspaper and cardboard. Art class is well supplied. Thanks! Friday Folders will be coming home today. Please look over the items inside and sign the two weekly forms.

**7th Grade Class** - We are getting closer to camp. I will send an email out this next week with some final thoughts before we head to Timber-lee. Thank you for signing up for snacks, and there is still time if you would like to. Snacks can come to school any time now (give to Miss Parker), or you can send the morning we leave. Several of us will be picking up trash this Saturday to earn some more \$\$ to cover the cost of camp!

8th Grade Class - Get excited for Outdoor Ed in ONE week! Thank you to all who have signed up to bring snacks for camp. You are more than welcome to drop them off in my classroom! Additionally, I started a new weekly tradition with 8th grade where we are going to take a class selfie. Here it is:)



### **Mathematics**

**5th Grade Math** - We are continuing to learn about place value with fractions and decimals. We will have a test on topic 1 next Tuesday. We are going back to the basic facts and reviewing multiplication and division, along with addition and subtraction. If you know your child doesn't have basic facts memorized, please have them practice at home. They need to know them to do their math homework.

**6th Grade Math** - This next week, we'll move onto fractions - multiplying them and dividing them. These are both really important math skills so we'll make sure we get lots of practice to know what we are doing! :)

**7th Grade Math** - This week we are finalizing chapter 1 and wrapping up our first unit on Rational Number Operations. We will be looking at a chapter test the following week. We are almost done with our i-Ready tests, and once we are, we will be looking at our results and using them to make individual targets/goals for what they want to improve on during the school year.

**8th Grade Math** -This week we are finalizing chapter 1 and wrapping up our first unit. We will be looking at a chapter test the following week. We are almost done with our i-Ready tests, and once we are, we will be looking at our results and using them to make individual targets/goals for what they want to improve on during the school year.

### Science

**5th Grade Science** - We are in our unit on fossils. Next week we will be learning how fossils form, how they are preserved, and what we can learn from them. We will be doing a fossil find

in some fossiliferous material from the Atlantic coast. We'll be on a hunt for shark teeth and students will identify their finds. They will bring them home and show you what they've found! We will also be learning all about Mary Anning. She has a great story so you'll have to ask your child to tell you all about her after we have studied her life story.

**6th Grade Science** - We are now learning about the immune system. Students are doing a little timeline project to show what we have learned about disease throughout history. I showed them some examples in class to get them on the right path. They have a rubric to see how they will be graded. We'll also be doing a group activity where students will act like epidemiologists to see if they can figure out the source of an epidemic to stop the spread of disease.

**7th Grade Life Science** - We will have a test on Monday over God's Living World. Students have a study guide to prepare them for the test. After that, we will be learning about our Native American Leaf Project. So look for those directions coming home.

**8th Grade Earth Science** - Students are doing an awesome job on the Amazing Map Race!! This class is so creative and fun to do projects with! We will learn all about how Earth is God's Goldilock's Zone - everything about it is "just right!"

### Literature

**5th Grade Literature** / **ELA**- We are reading Personal Narratives and reading a story about names and what names mean. Reading calendars need 400 minutes by the end of September, and a summary on the back of what was read. We are analyzing names and reading a story about a girl named Jennifer who didn't have a middle name.

6th Grade ELA - "A reader lives a thousand lives before he dies.....The man who never reads, lives only one." George R.R. Martin

We have set up our Google Classroom accounts and Whooo's Reading accounts. We discussed goals for Whooo's Reading (Online program) and did a practice quiz after reading a story together. Students need to do 3 practice questions, 2 reviews, and 2 quizzes by the end of the quarter. They are able to do any book they read this quarter. All students need a SSR book with them daily. Reading Calendars - typically, this is the only homework I try to give in reading class. Calendars are due the school day following the last day of the month. If students read in my class for SSR or class reading, those minutes do not go toward their calendar. Calendar minutes are done on 'their time'. If you have a question, please ask. We learned about one specific hero during the attack on 9/11 and discussed character traits. Students learned what a thesaurus was and how to use an online version. They were pretty amazed and that makes my heart happy.

7th Grade ELA - "A reader lives a thousand lives before he dies.....The man who never reads, lives only one." George R.R. Martin

We have set up our Google Classroom accounts and Whooo's Reading accounts. Students need to do 3 practice questions, 2 reviews, and 2 quizzes by the end of the quarter. They are able to do any book they read this quarter. We discussed goals for Whooo's Reading. All

students need a SSR book daily. Students are working in small groups to write their own drama circles. They are realizing that this type of writing which involves a lot of sequencing is tough to write.

8th Grade ELA - "A reader lives a thousand lives before he dies.....The man who never reads, lives only one." George R.R. Martin

We have set up our Google Classroom accounts and Whooo's Reading accounts. Students need to do 3 practice questions, 2 reviews, and 2 quizzes by the end of the quarter. They are able to do any book they read this quarter. We discussed goals for Whooo's Reading. All students need a SSR book daily. Our readings have varied from AI to Heroes of 9/11; no matter what we read, our brain is a muscle and only gets stronger the more it is used. That is part of the visual we will look at as we start our next unit.

### **Social Studies**

**5th Grade Geography** - We will be learning about the 50 states and capitals, and are reading about Canada's economy and geography.

**6th Grade Social Studies** - We have been diving into our textbook on early humans and fossils in the world. This week we took a look at the Cave of Altimira in Spain where early humans painted on the cave's walls.

**7th Grade Social Studies**- This week in 7th grade we have been learning about slavery in the colonies and the Transatlantic Slave Trade.

**8th Grade Social Studies**- 8th grade has been exploring the different aspects of the Spanish American War and deep dived into the life of President Theodore Roosevelt. 6th, 7th, and 8th grade also discussed the events of 9/11 and watched a video of a survivor telling their story of 9/11.

### **Physical Education**

This week in PE we continued playing Matt Ball! 5th and 6th did a music, running, and exercise activity on Tuesday. 7th and 8th graders played Matt Ball on Monday and did a running activity on Thursday. Remember to have your gym uniform (preferrably washed) and shoes for next week!
