Message from the Principal -

In a world that often feels broken—filled with violence, division, pain, and uncertainty—it can be easy to feel overwhelmed or discouraged. As we witness these realities around us, we are reminded that this is not the way God intended His creation to be. Sin has entered the world and brought with it suffering and brokenness. Yet even in the midst of this, God speaks a powerful truth to us in Psalm 46:1: *“God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.”* We are not alone. In the chaos of this world, we have a firm and unshakable foundation in Christ.

As a ministry, our response is not to ignore the brokenness, but to meet it with the hope of the Gospel. We are called to be a light in the darkness, reflecting Christ in our words and actions. Jesus reminds us in John 16:33, *“In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”* This promise gives us peace—not because the world is free from trouble, but because Christ has already secured the victory. At St. John’s, we strive to live this out by creating an environment where students are grounded in truth, surrounded by care, and constantly pointed back to Jesus.

For our families, this means being intentional in how we guide our children through the realities they see and hear. It is important to acknowledge the brokenness of the world, but even more important to anchor our children in the truth of God’s Word. Colossians 3:2 reminds us, *“Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things.”* When our eyes are fixed on Christ, we are able to navigate fear and uncertainty with confidence, knowing that God is in control. Through prayer, Scripture, and meaningful conversations, we help our children develop a faith that is resilient and rooted in hope.

Even in the midst of pain, we are called to respond with love, compassion, and faith. As a school, church, and family community, we have the opportunity to model what it means to trust in God fully. Philippians 4:6–7 encourages us, *“Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God... will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.”* This is the peace we cling to and the peace we share. Though the world may be broken, our hope is not—because our hope is found in Jesus Christ.

“From the Eagle’s Nest”- (Updates from the Principal/School Board)

As part of our commitment to transparency and collaboration, the principal and school board will be sharing weekly/monthly updates with families. These updates will highlight new and upcoming changes, dialogues currently taking place, considerations under review, and any concerns being addressed. Our goal is to bridge communication between school leadership and

our families so that we can work together with unity and understanding. By keeping you informed, we hope to build trust, invite healthy dialogue, and ensure that every step forward is guided by our shared mission to nurture students in Christ-centered excellence.

1. We have begun the process to explore quotes for new bleachers in the gym. While still in fair condition, the parts necessary to fix them are obsolete and near impossible to find. If something happens to them, we are out of luck! Our amazing team of volunteers that oversee the annual Golf Outing (looking for new volunteers) dedicate those funds to gym improvements. We plan to look at utilizing those funds, grants, and exploring budget measures we can make to plan for such a project.
2. We are currently in the process of evaluating a new physical education curriculum for all grades. As a school, we are looking for improvements in incorporating physical education alongside promoting healthy lifestyles through targeted efforts in phy ed classes from 4K-8th.
3. As a school board we are continuing to evaluate new ways to get families involved in the school board as members. If you have interest in serving on the school board, please let us know!
4. Our new security film for the lower and upper lobby windows is ahead of schedule! Both lobbies will have our new safety film installed and completed before Easter. Great news!
5. We have hired a new SNSP staff member for the 2026-2027 school year. Mr. Mike Price will be joining us from Beaver Dam school district with 18 years of special needs education experience. We are excited for Mr. Price to be joining our SJLS staff!
6. For our upcoming voter's meeting (call for a principal) we will be presenting our candidates the call committee has interviewed since our last decline of call by Dr. Nelson. We will provide profiles of the candidate details as soon as we can. Our voter's meeting is on April 13 after the 5:00 pm service.
7. Our elevator is currently out of order. We are working diligently to get it repaired and just approved the purchase of the required part to make it operational. It will take time to receive the part and get it fixed; but we are working to do so promptly.

While we could go on about all the amazing things taking place, we pray these glimpses give an insight into the many major items under consideration or current projects. We are excited to continually make improvements to glorify God and provide the very best for our students, families, and staff.
