Message from the Principal -

As we begin the first week of Advent, we enter a season of preparation—a time to quiet our hearts and focus our minds on the true meaning of Christmas. While the world around us rushes into decorations, shopping, and celebrations, Advent invites us to slow down and reflect on the incredible promise God fulfilled through His Son, Jesus Christ. Isaiah 40:3 reminds us, "Prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God." As we light the first Advent candle and begin this sacred season together, may our families, classrooms, and community be filled with joyful anticipation. Let us prepare with prayer, worship, and acts of kindness that reflect Christ's love. May this Advent season draw us closer to the

heart of Jesus, so that when Christmas arrives, we celebrate not just a holiday, but the miracle of God becoming man for our salvation. May He fill your home and heart with hope, peace, and joy as we prepare the way of the Lord.

"From the Eagle's Nest"-(Updates from the Principal/School Board)

As part of our commitment to transparency and collaboration, the principal and school board will be sharing weekly/monthly updates with families. These updates will highlight new and upcoming changes, dialogues currently taking place, considerations under review, and any concerns being addressed. Our goal is to bridge communication between school leadership and our families so that we can work together with unity and understanding. By keeping you informed, we hope to build trust, invite healthy dialogue, and ensure that every step forward is guided by our shared mission to nurture students in Christ-centered excellence.

- 1. We are currently in the process of our 2025-2026 accreditation process. Committees are formed and working hard to achieve NLSA accreditation for our school review in April, 2026. We are excited to share the great things we are doing here at SJLM.
- 2. We are continuing our search for a full-time/part-time band director for 2025-2026. We are loving our collaboration with Anne Widener from Martin Luther High School, but we have aspirations to house our very own band program/parish of music director for our church and school. If anyone has leads as we get into the school year, feel free to reach out
- 3. In our discussion regarding evaluating changes to our fundraising efforts for Outdoor Ed and the 8th grade trip, we have discussed a few changes we are going to be tasked with:
 - a. A fundraiser calendar
 - b. Introductory meeting taking place 6th grade year
 - c. Introductions to major trip dates/costs at open house annually
 - d. Improved system for planning out fundraisers/avoiding oversaturation
- 4. We have begun the process to explore quotes for new bleachers in the gym. While still in fair condition, the parts necessary to fix them are obsolete and near impossible to find. If something happens to them, we are out of luck! Our amazing team of volunteers that oversee the annual Golf Outing (looking for new volunteers) dedicate those funds to gym improvements. We plan to look at utilizing those funds, grants, and exploring budget measures we can make to plan for such a project.
- 5. We are currently in the process of initiating a call for an SNSP Co-Director and gym teacher. Deborah Hainer, Nikki Emmer, Angela Karel, and Jessica Roecker will join Mr. Mageski in a committee to search for a candidate with the proper qualifications we have laid out in our previous email posting. We will be looking for someone with special needs education experience and a licensure in "Cross Categorical Special Education".

6. As announced, we also will be initiating a call for the principal position for 2026-2027. That committee will include Douglas Mageski, Jack Dobbratz, Zach Weninger, Pastor Cutler, Brooke Krueger, and Faye Hazelberg. We will be initiating our search next week with hopes of making first contacts with possible candidates the first week of December. Once recommended candidates are identified, they will be brought to the congregation for consideration and approval.

While we could go on about all the amazing things taking place, we pray these glimpses give an insight into the many major items under consideration or current projects. We are excited to continually make improvements to glorify God and provide the very best for our students, families, and staff.

5th Grade News

5th Grade Homeroom-

Parts for the Christmas service should be memorized. No scripts will be used next week. Our Advent program dress rehearsal is at 8:30 A.M. on Friday, December 12th, and the program will be at 5:30 P.M. on Saturday, December 13th, both are at the church. Check Skyward for missing assignments your child's planner to keep track of homework. Spelling and handwriting are always due on Fridays unless there is no school. Memory is always on Tuesday and Thursday.

5th Grade Literature/ELA - No spelling test until next week! We had our Unit 14 spelling test today. Unit 15 will be next Friday. We are still working on The Renaissance and are writing a 5-paragraph essay. The rough draft was due today, and we will revise it on Monday.

5th Grade Math- Math test next week, Wednesday! Keep practicing long division steps at home and multiplication facts. We still have to finish up our tests on Monday!

5th Grade Science - Next week, we'll be doing some activities measuring matter, volume, and density! We'll learn all about Archimedes, one of my favorite scientists. We'll also have some fun making density towers.

5th Grade Geography - We did a very short unit on Antarctica and are creating slideshows about it, which are due on Monday.

6th Grade News

6th Grade Homeroom - Today we talked about our Christmas and doing a classroom party. Students chose a Secret Santa type gift exchange. I am sending an email today with extra information. All students did receive an informational sheet that their Secret Santa completed. Remember that our Advent program dress rehearsal is at 8:30 A.M. on Friday, December 12th, and the program will be at 5:30 P.M. on Saturday, December 13th, and both are up at the church.

6th Grade ELA - We will be doing the play *The Odyssey* next week. It is part of our Greek mythology unit. Each student chose a Greek figure to research and do a poster project on. They will wrap it up with a speech. The final Greek character posters are due Dec. 8. We are

working hard on picking out the different parts of speech in our writing. December Reading Calendars are due 1/5.

6th Grade Math - We will be wrapping up numerical expressions and will move onto algebraic expressions!

6th Grade Science - We continue to make notecards about an element each day. Students are making the atomic Bohr model projects at home. They are due Monday, 12/8! Students are also turning an element of their choice into a superhero or supervillian, so that is kinda fun! This next week, we will be counting atoms and elements in formulas and then will learn how to balance chemical equations. We'll also learn how ionic and covalent bonding work.

6th Grade Social Studies - This week 6th grade has learned about the Great Pyramids of Egypt. They learned about burials, how the pyramids may have been built, and what the insides of the pyramids look like. We also played a game were they had to pretend to be a Tomb Raider to steal the treasure in the Pyramid after learning about how often the graves were stolen from.

7th Grade News

7th Grade Homeroom - Our Advent program dress rehearsal is at 8:30 A.M. on Friday, December 12th, and the program will be at 5:30 P.M. on Saturday, December 13th, both are up at the church. The Merry Basket email was sent out, so be sure to check it out.

7th Grade ELA -

Red Scarf Girl is a challenging book because it is a historical fiction book that takes place during the Chinese Cultural Revolution which is a newer topic for the class. We are working hard on prepositional phrases and their importance in our writing. December Reading Calendars are due 1/5.


7th Grade Math - We just finished up our chapter 3 test. We are going to work ahead and begin our chapter on surface area and volume of three-dimensional figures. Please remember Math calendars are still due each Friday.

7th Grade Life Science - We wrapped up mitosis, and students are making mitosis flipbooks. We will be doing an activity with sweet and sour chromosomes, learning about haploid and diploid numbers, and then doing a pigeon project. We'll finish up next week, learning about karyotyping and doing two activities matching up chromosomes.

7th Grade Social Studies- 7th grade has begun writing an opinion paper on the Revolutionary War to wrap up the unit. The paper is due next Friday!

8th Grade News
