“Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord.” (Acts 3:19)

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, which is on February 18th. This is known as a season of repentance. It is a time to reflect upon our lives and the change that needs to take place. Repentance is not just a thinking about change. It is an action, a changing of an attitude that will most often be reflected in a change of life.

As we are brought to our knees in repentance, may we know of God's forgiveness for us in Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. The reason why Jesus came into this world was to be the sacrifice for all of our sins. As we mourn our sin and realize its consequences in our lives, may that guilt drive us to the cross, so that we might seek forgiveness from the only one who can give it, Jesus Christ, our Savior.

So often, in our despair, we do not turn to the Lord for His healing power. In our pride, we think that we can handle it on our own, or we turn to other things for our source of comfort and strength. We get a sense of temporary relief, but it is not the full pardon and peace that God desires to give to us.

Through the forgiveness of Jesus Christ, the refreshing times will be upon us. That refreshment doesn't come before the trying and painful times of repentance. As we recognize our sin, we also seek the Lord and his forgiveness for us. Through faith, we see that forgiveness that is appropriated to us.

Lent is a time in which we travel through in order to get to the refreshment and joy of Easter. This is a picture of our lives. It really is to be a picture of our congregation.

We are to turn to the Lord. This is what prayer is. It is a recognition that God is the one who has the power and strength to give us the things that we need for refreshment. The change that is needed for all of us is a deeper committed life in prayer. This will be the emphasis for my life, and I pray for the life of the congregation, as we change through the power of the Holy Spirit. Pray for this to take place, according to God's will.

COME AND SEE!!!

Continuing into this new year we continue through the Third Article explanation from Luther's Large Catechism in the Book of Concord (BoC): "Neither you nor I could ever know anything about Christ, or believe in him and receive him as Lord, unless these were offered to us and bestowed on our hearts through the preaching of the gospel by the Holy Spirit. The work is finished and completed; Christ has acquired and won the treasure for us by his sufferings, death, and resurrection, etc. But if the work remained hidden so that no one knew of it, it would have been all in vain, all lost. In order that the treasure might not remain buried but be put to use and enjoyed, God has caused the Word to be published and proclaimed, in which he has given the Holy Spirit to offer and apply to us this treasure, this redemption. Therefore being made holy is nothing else than bringing us to the Lord Christ to receive this blessing, to which we could not have

come by ourselves (BoC, p.436)."

I often ask in catechesis courses—both youth and adult—how is it that the forgiveness earned by Jesus two thousand years ago is brought to us today? If it weren't happening, we, the Church, would be nothing more than a museum, to paraphrase Dr. Dale Meyer. It is through the means of grace, the Word and the Sacraments, that the forgiveness and benefits earned by Jesus on the cross are given to us today, two thousand years later. We, dear brothers and sisters, have received them and continue to receive them—all because of grace, that is, because of what Jesus did for us!

Yet as we receive these gifts, we can look out at our families, our communities, our nation, and our world, and see how many people have not found the joy of forgiveness that we have found in Jesus. So what do we do? We invite them to come and hear and come and see what we have heard and what we have seen. Sometimes merely by saying, "Come and see."

Recently we had one of our weekly Greek studies and we were preparing for a text about John the Baptist's disciples. John, as the last great prophet, points his disciples to go and follow Jesus now, the Lamb of God (John 1:29-42). When his disciples approach Jesus to now speak with Him, they ask where Jesus is staying. And Jesus Himself invites them saying, "Come and you will see." This paves the way for when, in the following verses, Philip invites Nathaniel to meet Jesus whom Philip and the others wonder if He is the Christ. Nathaniel asks "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" and Philip replies, "Come and see."

During that study of the text in Greek, a brother pastor suggested that perhaps, as we have signs for those leaving church which say "You are now entering the mission field," we should also have a sign for entering church that says "Come and see." I include this not to advocate for the sign—though if you want to have one, I wouldn't be against it—but to show the usefulness of even this simple phrase in bringing others to Jesus. When we cause others to come with these words, it is nothing other than "bringing (them) to the Lord Christ to receive this blessing," putting them in position for the Holy Spirit to make them holy along with us.

We cannot come to our Lord and Savior "by ourselves," so we thank God daily, hourly, and, perhaps, even minute-by-minute for coming to us in the washing of Holy Baptism, the receiving of His Word, and thanking God for the one(s) who first brought us, whether it was our parents or whoever else! In Jesus' Name. Amen!

NEWS FROM SCHOOL



Patience and perseverance are often shaped not in moments of ease, but in seasons of difficulty. Scripture reminds us that struggles are not wasted in God's hands. James writes, *"Consider it pure joy... whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance"* (James 1:2–3). While hardship is never easy, God uses it to strengthen our faith, refine our character, and draw us closer to Him. Patience does not mean ignoring pain or rushing past it—it means trusting that God is at work even when the outcome is not yet clear.

Perseverance grows when we fix our eyes on Christ rather than our circumstances. Paul encourages us in Galatians 6:9, *"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."* When struggles linger, it is tempting to lose heart or feel discouraged. Yet God promises that endurance rooted in faith produces hope. Romans 5:3–4 assures us that *"suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope."* Each step forward—no matter how small—is a testimony to God's sustaining grace.

As we walk through challenging seasons, we are reminded that we do not do so alone. The Lord promises, *"Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength"* (Isaiah 40:31). Patience and perseverance are gifts God provides through His Word, His people, and His presence. May we lean on Him daily, trusting that He is faithful to carry us through every struggle, shaping us for His purposes and strengthening us to reflect His love and hope to others.

2026-2027 School Year Enrollment Opens February 1:

St. John's Lutheran 2026-2027 school year enrollment is open beginning February 1, 2026. If you are a family with students currently enrolled at St. John's, your child(ren) will automatically be enrolled for next year and the registration fee will automatically be billed to TADS on April 20th, 2026. If you are a new family or have a child coming to St. John's for the first time, you will need to enroll them. You can find the enrollment form on the school web page.

WPCP (Wisconsin Parental Choice Program) Enrollment open February 1st as well. All families will need to register for that program and provide an approved residency verification document such as an electric or water bill or home internet service with your name and address on it, including current families in the program. Additionally, new families will need to provide income verification. If you need any assistance with this registration process, feel free to reach out to Mrs. Krueger in the office. She will gladly assist you.

If you are interested or know of a family looking for a school home for the 2026-2027 school year, please contact the office at 920-387-4310. We participate in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program, the Special Needs Scholarship Program, and have scholarship opportunities available.

St. John's is part of the **South Wisconsin District**. The District is divided into groups called Zones, with about 6 churches each. Each church has a society organization that is affiliated with the LWML.

We participate in Spring and Fall Rallies and host on a rotation basis with the other churches in our Zone.

The District hosts the Fall Retreat, Young Women's Retreat and SWD Convention.




