Message from the Principal -

Patience and perseverance are often shaped not in moments of ease, but in seasons of difficulty. Scripture reminds us that struggles are not wasted in God's hands. James writes, "Consider it pure joy... whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance" (James 1:2–3). While hardship is never easy, God uses it to strengthen our faith, refine our character, and draw us closer to Him. Patience does not mean ignoring pain or rushing past it—it means trusting that God is at work even when the outcome is not yet clear.

Perseverance grows when we fix our eyes on Christ rather than our circumstances. Paul encourages us in Galatians 6:9, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." When struggles linger, it is tempting to lose heart or feel discouraged. Yet God promises that endurance rooted in faith produces hope. Romans 5:3–4 assures us that "suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope." Each step forward—no matter how small—is a testimony to God's sustaining grace.

As we walk through challenging seasons, we are reminded that we do not do so alone. The Lord promises, "Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength" (Isaiah 40:31). Patience and perseverance are gifts God provides through His Word, His people, and His presence. May we lean on Him daily, trusting that He is faithful to carry us through every struggle, shaping us for His purposes and strengthening us to reflect His love and hope to others.

“From the Eagle’s Nest”- (Updates from the Principal/School Board)

As part of our commitment to transparency and collaboration, the principal and school board will be sharing weekly/monthly updates with families. These updates will highlight new and upcoming changes, dialogues currently taking place, considerations under review, and any concerns being addressed. Our goal is to bridge communication between school leadership and our families so that we can work together with unity and understanding. By keeping you informed, we hope to build trust, invite healthy dialogue, and ensure that every step forward is guided by our shared mission to nurture students in Christ-centered excellence.

1. We are currently in the process of our 2025-2026 accreditation process. Committees are formed and working hard to achieve NLSA accreditation for our school review in April, 2026. We are excited to share the great things we are doing here at SJLM.
2. We are continuing our search for a full-time/part-time band director for 2025-2026. We are loving our collaboration with Anne Widener from Martin Luther High School, but we have aspirations to house our very own band program/parish of music director for our

church and school. If anyone has leads as we get into the school year, feel free to reach out.

3. In our discussion regarding evaluating changes to our fundraising efforts for Outdoor Ed and the 8th grade trip, we have discussed a few changes we are going to be tasked with:
 - a. A fundraiser calendar
 - b. Introductory meeting taking place 6th grade year
 - c. Introductions to major trip dates/costs at open house annually
 - d. Improved system for planning out fundraisers/avoiding oversaturation
4. We have begun the process to explore quotes for new bleachers in the gym. While still in fair condition, the parts necessary to fix them are obsolete and near impossible to find. If something happens to them, we are out of luck! Our amazing team of volunteers that oversee the annual Golf Outing (looking for new volunteers) dedicate those funds to gym improvements. We plan to look at utilizing those funds, grants, and exploring budget measures we can make to plan for such a project.
5. There is a SJLM voter's meeting on Monday, January 12 at 6:30 pm to extend a call to one of two candidates suggested by the call committee. All SJLC members 18+ are welcome to attend and vote on the decision to extend a call.
6. Two containers have been donated by Bill Muche (Thank you so much!). They are currently on the northeast corner of the campus (until the ground is more firm), but they eventually will go behind the west side of the lobby for additional storage and replace our aging sheds.
7. Dr. Todd Stirn (called principal via voter's meeting on 1/12/26), will be visiting our ministry 1/17-1/18 as he deliberates on his call. We are excited to host Todd and his wife Angela. They will be attending the 8:15 am service on 1/18. Stop by and introduce yourself!

While we could go on about all the amazing things taking place, we pray these glimpses give an insight into the many major items under consideration or current projects. We are excited to continually make improvements to glorify God and provide the very best for our students, families, and staff.

5th Grade News

5th Grade Homeroom-

Quarter 2 ends today. Please replenish pencils, erasers, and pens. Check Skyward for missing assignments, and your child's planner to keep track of homework. Spelling and handwriting are always due on Fridays unless there is no school. Memory is always on Tuesday and Thursday. No school on Monday!

5th Grade Literature/ELA - Reading calendars for January are due February 2nd. We are reading Don Quixote, which is about a man who reads about knighthood and thinks that he is a knight. We are writing an essay on soil in WI. We are also starting a 5-8 grade project, which is writing our own children's books. February 26th is our young author night, and we will be presenting our books. Please mark this date on your calendars. These books will be handwritten and illustrated in class. They are an in-school project. They may plan parts at home, but the bulk of the work will be done in class. We are learning different literary techniques and the different parts of a story.

5th Grade Math- Math calendars are due January 30th. We are now learning about fractions and how to find the common denominator, as well as improper fractions and mixed numbers. There will be a math test over fractions the week after next.

5th Grade Science - We have been busy classifying matter. Next week, we'll learn about changes of states of matter and then we'll learn about mixtures and solutions. Students will enjoy our Tasty Solution Lab. They brought home a fun experiment to try over the 3-day weekend.

5th Grade Geography - We have moved on to the Continent of Africa and are learning about animals, diseases, and climates in Africa.

6th Grade News

6th Grade Homeroom - As we begin the second semester, students may need to replenish school supplies like red pens, pencils, and erasers. We will be working on our I-Ready tests next week. It is important to get a good night's sleep, drink enough water, eat a good breakfast, and have a healthy snack. The tests help the teachers plan and implement lessons.

6th Grade ELA - We have begun our Children's Book unit which will culminate in a Young Author's Night on Thursday, February 26 at 6:00 PM. It is important that all students are in attendance for this event. We have been working on analyzing children's books, recognizing figurative language, and using imagery. Next week we will be working on plot lines and begin our brainstorming. January Reading Calendars are due Feb 2.

6th Grade Math - Students will be taking their iReady winter diagnostic this week! We continue to work on skills each day to brush up on them so we are ready for the test. We also set goals based on our last scores.

6th Grade Science - We are wrapping up our chemistry unit early this next week. We will be moving onto motion and machines. We'll begin by learning about basic push and pull forces and vectors.

6th Grade Social Studies - 6th grade has been looking at Hinduism and Buddhism this week. They have analyzed the similarities and differences between the two and how they were important in Ancient India.

7th Grade News

7th Grade Homeroom - Let's start the second half of the year off on the right foot! Please replenish any pencils, red pens, etc. that your student may have used up the first half of the year. Next week, we'll be taking the iReady diagnostic in reading and math so make sure students get a good night's sleep, eat a healthy breakfast, and are ready to rock and roll! 
