"The King is Coming"

Matthew 25:19 "After a long time the master of those servants returned and settled accounts with them."

I Timothy 6:13b-15 "I charge you to keep this command without spot or blame until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ, which God will bring about in his own time - God, the blessed and only Ruler, the King of kings and Lord of lords."

II Timothy 1:6 "I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you thorough the laying on of my hands."

Advent is a season looking with hope for the coming King. The reality is this: the King is going to come, whether we want Him to come or not. We don't have an option. As Christians, we look with expectation for the coming King.

Our faithful King has given us everlasting life, through His suffering and death upon the cross. When the King comes, He will give to us the kingdom because of His grace. And yet, He will also ask for an accounting of all of His gifts while we lived here on this earth. The King will return for an accounting.

Now, this may really make us uneasy, because in our rebellious state, we want to be a people who are not accountable, or we want to pick and choose what we want to be accountable for. We tend to forget that we are not the ones who give out the gifts. The King does that. And He knows the gifts that He has given to us individually. There is no fooling God.

And yet, we do have a choice on whether we want to exercise a gift or not. I cannot exercise the gift or gifts that God has given to you. I can only be responsible for the gifts that God has given to me as an individual. As a preacher of the Word, I can only remind you to "fan into flame the gift that God has given to you." I can only remind you of the coming King, and that there will be an accounting.

The freedom of the individual Christian is to use the gifts that the King has given in whatever way that they feel that the King would want it to be used, to the King's glory and to the furthering of His kingdom. And yet, the facts of the King giving out the gift as well as His sure and certain return remain.

Christmas is a time of gifts and presents. The greatest gift that we could receive is God's only Son, Jesus Christ. We want to spread that gift to the ends of the earth. May God use us as His instruments in making disciples of all nations, until the King comes back in all His glory.

In October we had our South Wisconsin District Fall Conference. Our theme was Christian Education; and our speakers demonstrated how good Christian education is encouraged throughout our books, including Luther's Works, the Smalcald Articles, and the Apology (defense) of the Augsburg Confession. The speakers were Rev. Ben Ball and CTSFW (Concordia Theological Seminary Fort Wayne) President Rev. Dr. Jon Bruss.

Rev. Ball began with how all pastors are called as ones apt to teach. Then he reminded us of the Great Commission from Matt. 28 in which Christ calls us to make disciples of all nations, baptizing them, and *teaching* them all that He has commanded us. He spoke on how Jesus knew His vocations and lived them each out; and He, as Mark 6 reminds us, had compassion in His teaching. Rev. Ball continued with how fathers and mothers have been called to teach their children in the fear of the Lord (as we also see children encouraged in Proverbs and other Scriptures to pay heed to their parents' instruction). He pointed again to the dynamic of parents (or other authorities) and children (those under their authority)—that children and those under authority honor their authorities, but also that authorities not provoke those under their care to anger as both authority figure and subordinate are under God's authority.

Next Rev. Ball led on how to teach. He said that since the church is devoted to the apostolic teaching, so, too, then, should our schools be. All Christians should be willing to teach about Jesus. But, if you will be sharing more than just "Come and see," James 3 tells you that you need to know what you have to say. In order to know what you are saying means being in the Word in a regular basis, not only at home, but in worship and Bible Study. Yet we also have a great freedom in teaching God's Word which no one else has. Because we have God's Word in its full truth and purity, we can teach and speak it with certainty and without doubting because we know that it is God's Word that we are receiving (as opposed to other denominations which add to or take away from God's Word, and tell their members "We'll tell you what you need to know...").

All this can be done only through solid Christian education. Luther wrote to the princes of his time to spend their money for good order in society, and so to support their schools. Parents are also to be invested in the education of their children because it is a matter not only of their children's temporal welfare but also their eternal. Luther wrote that not just boys should receive proper education but also girls, that each may live out their God-given vocations in God pleasing ways. Luther encouraged parents directly, writing that God has not given them children to bring them up as they please, but for His purposes and service. In that sense, then, sending children to school and funding those schools are services rendered to God by parents as part of their vocations.

Luther wrote that next to preaching, teaching is the most important task. This is because as parents send their children to school, they can be brought up to be pastors. Yet Luther also wrote on the good that it is that children also be taught well so that they may be jurists (work in government and other service vocations). For all these reasons our ancestors coming to the New World from Europe so valued schools that they decided that every place they would plant a church, they would also plant a school. There was such a strong push for this that, believe it or not, in 1872, there were more schools being planted than even churches.

But in order for schools to make pastors and God-fearing men and women for society, parents must be involved in the school systems. They should be on the boards. If there are immoral teachers in parochial or public schools, they should vote to have them removed. After all, do we really want immoral people teaching our children? Or do we want them to be brought up to be God-fearing and pious? It is not the duty of the state to make souls pious or to save them; that is the duty of the Church, and one way it is brought about is through parents living out their vocations.

In business sections, District President Meader revealed his intention to focus on mission in our district congregations. He wants us to recognize that families are mixed, but that that is a blessing. In our district, 10% of congregations are calling for sole or senior pastors, and almost that same amount Synod-wide. We also need more LERT training. With the flooding in Milwaukee this fall, very few went in to assist. Not all LERT training is for those who run chainsaws. We want to be able to serve in any emergency, so we need more church members trained to help in those times of emergency.

CTSFW President Rev. Bruss talked about how there was order when God created. This order refers not only to gravity, but also to outward discipline, honorable conduct, good behavior, customs, and usages (e.g. languages). The way that we human beings orient to this order is through reason and learning. Our reason does not save us, but it is how we learn to live life as ones who have been redeemed. He also spoke briefly on updates to CTSFW that he wants to accomplish including that the campus buildings are no longer run-down but modern and inviting; that the faculty are top-notch; and that they bring in only top-notch men to be pastors, in order to encourage men to strive in their education.

May God bless us as we strive to Reach, Teach, and Share the Gospel in coordination with our brothers and sisters district-wide, Synod-wide, and world-wide—it's all about Jesus! In Jesus' name. Amen.

Childcare/Youth Center November 2025 Report

This final progress report signifies that the Childcare/Youth Center project is now 99.7% complete. The facility successfully passed its final inspection on November 14, 2025, and has been officially approved for occupancy. Only a handful of minor tasks remain outstanding; these will be addressed and completed in the upcoming weeks. An Open House and building dedication have been scheduled for Sunday, December 7, 2025. This event will provide an opportunity for the members of our congregation, people from the community and surrounding area to tour the new facility. The successful completion of this project is the result of the unwavering commitment and collaboration of every member of the Building Committee. Their dedication and support have been critical to achieving the project's goals. Several of those individuals need to be recognized for their extraordinary contributions to the project's success:

- Perry Muche: Volunteered thousands of hours assisting Dave Boelter of Benter Building with a wide variety of tasks each week, from the project's inception through its completion.
- Bob Schroeder: Also volunteered thousands of hours constructing benches, coat hangers, and storage units; staining and varnishing them; installing all cabinetry in individual rooms and the kitchen; finishing window trim; and performing numerous additional tasks throughout the project.
- Encore (Bruce Muche): Served as the electrical contractor and contributed additional volunteer hours to site cleanup and other project needs.
- Bill Muche and Family: Provided both manpower and equipment, offered storage, cleared and improved the railroad right-of-way, and completed a major portion of the landscaping work at no charge.
- Carl Benter used his vast construction expertise to design a building concept that would serve current childcare needs and allow for future expansion of our day school. He also introduced us to Tom Mickeljohn.
- Tom Mickeljohn, our architect whose design and construction knowledge was invaluable throughout the project

Throughout the course of construction, the project encountered several challenges that impacted both the timeline and the overall budget. There were numerous issues with suppliers, including not providing the correct materials or quantities, delivering incorrect parts, experiencing shipment delays, and at times failing to arrive as scheduled. These complications contributed to increased costs and required additional time and effort to resolve.

As previously outlined in earlier progress reports, the project faced significant rises in material costs. Additionally, unexpected site conditions—specifically, areas of soft soil in three separate locations—necessitated removal and replacement, further adding to expenses. The requirement by the State of Wisconsin to construct an emergency exit ramp also increased costs.

I want to acknowledge the many people who volunteered to assist the committee, Kristy Zahn-Roecker and Doug Majeski in different ways during this project.




