"From the Eagle's Nest"- (Updates from the Principal/School Board)

As part of our commitment to transparency and collaboration, the principal and school board will be sharing weekly/monthly updates with families. These updates will highlight new and upcoming changes, dialogues currently taking place, considerations under review, and any concerns being addressed. Our goal is to bridge communication between school leadership and our families so that we can work together with unity and understanding. By keeping you

informed, we hope to build trust, invite healthy dialogue, and ensure that every step forward is guided by our shared mission to nurture students in Christ-centered excellence.

1. We are currently in the process of our 2025-2026 accreditation process. Committees are formed and working hard to achieve NLSA accreditation for our school review in April, 2026. We are excited to share the great things we are doing here at SJLM.
2. We are continuing our search for a full-time/part-time band director for 2025-2026. We are loving our collaboration with Anne Widener from Martin Luther High School, but we have aspirations to house our very own band program/parish of music director for our church and school. If anyone has leads as we get into the school year, feel free to reach out.
3. In our discussion regarding evaluating changes to our fundraising efforts for Outdoor Ed and the 8th grade trip, we have discussed a few changes we are going to be tasked with:
 - a. A fundraiser calendar
 - b. Introductory meeting taking place 6th grade year
 - c. Introductions to major trip dates/costs at open house annually
 - d. Improved system for planning out fundraisers/avoiding oversaturation
4. We have begun the process to explore quotes for new bleachers in the gym. While still in fair condition, the parts necessary to fix them are obsolete and near impossible to find. If something happens to them, we are out of luck! Our amazing team of volunteers that oversee the annual Golf Outing (looking for new volunteers) dedicate those funds to gym improvements. We plan to look at utilizing those funds, grants, and exploring budget measures we can make to plan for such a project.
5. We are currently in the process of initiating a call for an SNSP Co-Director and gym teacher. Deborah Hainer, Nikki Emmer, Angela Karel, and Jessica Roecker will join Mr. Mageski in a committee to search for a candidate with the proper qualifications we have laid out in our previous email posting. We will be looking for someone with special needs education experience and a licensure in "Cross Categorical Special Education".
6. There is a SJLM voter's meeting on Monday, January 12 at 6:30 pm to extend a call to one of two candidates suggested by the call committee. All SJLC members 18+ are welcome to attend and vote on the decision to extend a call.
7. Two containers have been donated by Bill Muche (Thank you so much!). They are currently on the northeast corner of the campus (until the ground is more firm), but they eventually will go behind the west side of the lobby for additional storage and replace our aging sheds.

While we could go on about all the amazing things taking place, we pray these glimpses give an insight into the many major items under consideration or current projects. We are excited to continually make improvements to glorify God and provide the very best for our students, families, and staff.

5th Grade News

5th Grade Homeroom-

Quarter 2 ends next Friday. Please replenish pencils, erasers and pens. Check Skyward for missing assignments, and your child's planner to keep track of homework. Spelling and handwriting are always due on Fridays unless there is no school. Memory is always on Tuesday and Thursday.

5th Grade Literature/ELA - Reading calendars for January are due February 2nd. We are reading Don Quixote, which is about a man who reads about knighthood and thinks that he is a knight. We are writing an essay on soil in WI, and the rough draft is due on Monday. We are also starting a 5-8 grade project, which is writing our own children's books. February 26th is our young author night, and we will be presenting our books. Please mark this date on your calendars. These books will be handwritten and illustrated in class. They are an in-school project. They may plan parts at home, but the bulk of the work will be done in class. We are learning different literary techniques and the different parts of a story.

5th Grade Math- I put a math calendar in Friday folders for kids to start over break. This calendar is due January 30th. We are now learning about fractions and how to find the common denominator.

5th Grade Science - We are in our unit on matter and have been learning about the 4 states of matter. We'll be working on classifying matter next week.

5th Grade Geography - We have moved on to the Continent of Africa and are learning about animals, diseases, and climates in Africa.

6th Grade News

6th Grade Homeroom - Pretty crazy to think that next week, Friday is the end of quarter 2, which means we are halfway through the school year. A few kiddos may need to resupply basic school items such as pencils and red pens.

6th Grade ELA - We have begun our Children's Book unit which will culminate in a Young Author's Night on Thursday, February 26 at 6:00 PM. It is important that all students are in attendance for this event.

6th Grade Math - Students took the test on algebraic expressions and now we are moving onto algebraic equations and inequalities.

6th Grade Science - We did a lab on the conservation of mass and about endothermic reactions. Next week, we'll do a lab on acids and bases and learn about how they combine to make salts. We'll then finish up the unit by designing fireworks which use these minerals salts.

6th Grade Social Studies - We have started our next unit on the Indus Civilization and Ancient India. The students have also completed an activity where they got to role play the Indian Caste system.

7th Grade News
