# Message from the Principal -

As Christians, we are called to reflect the love of Jesus in all we do, living with a servant's heart that mirrors His grace, compassion, and humility. Jesus Himself reminds us, "For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45). When we look at Christ's example, we see that true greatness in God's Kingdom is found not in power or recognition, but in loving service to others. Having a servant's heart means noticing needs, offering help without being asked, and choosing kindness even when it's difficult.

At SJLS, we have daily opportunities to live out this calling. Students can show a servant's heart by encouraging classmates, including someone who feels left out, helping a teacher without being prompted, or speaking words that build others up. Families can model Christian service by praying together, practicing forgiveness quickly, and showing Christlike patience. Scripture reminds us, "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you" (Ephesians 4:32). When we offer grace in our relationships—especially during stressful or challenging moments—we reflect Jesus to everyone around us.

Within our church and school community, God invites us to serve with joy. Worshiping together, participating in service projects, volunteering for events, or supporting ministries are all ways we share Christ's love. At home, serving may look like helping with chores, showing respect, or caring for siblings with love. In our wider community, families can serve by thanking first responders, donating food, praying for neighbors, or offering help to someone in need. Jesus calls us to shine His light: "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

As we "Make a Joyful Noise" this school year, may our hearts echo the joy of serving others in Jesus' name. A servant's heart is not something we achieve on our own—it is the Holy Spirit working within us, helping us grow in grace, love, and forgiveness. May God bless our students,

our families, and our entire SJLS community as we seek to live lives that reflect His love in our school, our church, our homes, and our community.

# "From the Eagle's Nest"-(Updates from the Principal/School Board)

As part of our commitment to transparency and collaboration, the principal and school board will be sharing weekly/monthly updates with families. These updates will highlight new and upcoming changes, dialogues currently taking place, considerations under review, and any concerns being addressed. Our goal is to bridge communication between school leadership and our families so that we can work together with unity and understanding. By keeping you informed, we hope to build trust, invite healthy dialogue, and ensure that every step forward is guided by our shared mission to nurture students in Christ-centered excellence.

- 1. We are currently in the process of our 2025-2026 accreditation process. Committees are formed and working hard to achieve NLSA accreditation for our school review in April, 2026. We are excited to share the great things we are doing here at SJLM.
- 2. There have been a few concerns about security needs on campus and we wanted to share we have approved and/or we are discussing the following improvements:
  - a. Main doors locked at chapel time
  - b. Police patrolling presence before school, after school, and around chapel times (as they can accommodate)
  - c. Possible walkway/stairs between church parking lot and black top by school
  - d. Alternate relocation site for emergencies (Senior Center)
  - e. Shatter resistant window film for lower windows and lobbies
  - f. Improved communication for mass emails, texts, notifications
  - g. Improved/new key fob systems on lobbies and cameras in gym, lobbies, and outside perimeter of school building
- 3. We are continuing our search for a full-time/part-time band director for 2025-2026. We are loving our collaboration with Anne Widener from Martin Luther High School, but we have aspirations to house our very own band program/parish of music director for our church and school. If anyone has leads as we get into the school year, feel free to reach out.
- 4. Our school board has initiated a process to reevaluate and initiate an extensive strategic plan for our ministry in regards to 6 pillars: student services, faculty/staff services, growth and development, facilities, and partnerships. Our goal is to align all future tasks for our ministry to point back to our school mission, vision, and guiding values. We are very excited to continue praising God for the blessings we already have here at SJLM, but also, looking ahead to future years of success, growth, and ministry.

- 5. In our discussion regarding evaluating changes to our fundraising efforts for Outdoor Ed and the 8th grade trip, we have discussed a few changes we are going to be tasked with:
  - a. A fundraiser calendar
  - b. Introductory meeting taking place 6th grade year
  - c. Introductions to major trip dates/costs at open house annually
  - d. Improved system for planning out fundraisers/avoiding oversaturation
- 6. We have begun the process to explore quotes for new bleachers in the gym. While still in fair condition, the parts necessary to fix them are obsolete and near impossible to find. If something happens to them, we are out of luck! Our amazing team of volunteers that oversee the annual Golf Outing (looking for new volunteers) dedicate those funds to gym improvements. We plan to look at utilizing those funds, grants, and exploring budget measures we can make to plan for such a project.

While we could go on about all the amazing things taking place, we pray these glimpses give an insight into the many major items under consideration or current projects. We are excited to continually make improvements to glorify God and provide the very best for our students, families, and staff.

## -Middle School News-

## 5th Grade News

**5th Grade Homeroom-** Make sure you are checking Skyward for missing assignments and using the planner to keep track of your homework. Spelling and handwriting is always due on Fridays unless there is no school. Memory is always on Tuesday and Thursday.

**5th Grade Literature/ELA -** We created explosion books for our poetry unit. We are reading poems by Carrie Allen McCray, Virgil Suarez, and Lawrence Ferlinghetti and studying different literary styles.

**5th Grade Math** - We have started our chapter on division. If your child is struggling with multiplication facts, please continue to practice at home. They need those foundational facts to perform long division.

**5th Grade Science** - We will be learning about the blood vessels - arteries, veins, and capillaries. Then, we will learn all about blood - the plasma, white blood cells, red blood cells, and platelets. We'll then do a lab with blood types - A, AB, B, and O. So, if you know your child's blood type, it would be awesome to let them know what it is. :) We'll also learn about how our blood gets cleaned. We'll have our test that Tuesday right before Thanksgiving break.

**5th Grade Geography** - We are still studying the continent of South America, focusing on the country of Brazil with its people, ecosystems, climate, and physical features, and the destruction of the Amazon Rainforest.

## **6th Grade News**

**6th Grade Homeroom -** We look forward to seeing you Wednesday, November 19th when 6th grade will be presenting chapel to the school at 8:10 AM and then again for the congregation at 6:30 PM. We have planned for everyone to be a part of the service, so it is important for everyone to be there. Students should meet me at 6:20. It is going to be a wonderful message to everyone who comes to see. Students will get copies of their parts on Monday.

**6th Grade ELA -** "Somewhere inside all of us is the power to change the world." Roald Dahl We have begun our Greek Mythology unit and will begin a story on Pandora next week. All students are participating in the Doodle for Google contest. Final copies are due by Nov. 25th. We are working hard on picking out the different parts of speech in our writing. November Reading Calendars are due 12/1.

**6th Grade Math** - We have done some work with iReady Pro, looking at the data that we collected from the last diagnostic, and we tried to fill in some gaps and review a few things before diving into our next unit, which is numeric and algebraic expressions. We have gone over powers of 10, exponents, and order of operations/symbols. We will be moving ahead with understanding and representing exponents and finding GCF (greatest common factor) and LCM (least common multiple). These topics are very foundational for what is coming up next.

**6th Grade Science** - We continue to make notecards about an element each day. Students now have the directions for the atomic Bohr model projects. They are due Monday, 12/8 (plenty of time, some weekends in there, trying to respect hunting and Thanksgiving family time too). We'll move forward this week with learning about the Periodic Table and how it is organized by making a color-coded Periodic Table. I will highly encourage the students to hold onto these because they will be quite useful in future science classes - even high school!

**6th Grade Social Studies** - 6th grade has been exploring Ancient Egypt. This week they made a social class pyramid with the importance and roles of the different jobs within the social classes.

# 7th Grade News

**7th Grade Homeroom** - We have begun to prepare for the Advent service. Our dress rehearsal is at 8:30 A.M. on Friday, December 12th, and the program will be at 5:30 P.M. on Saturday, December 13th, both are up at the church. Our Merry Basket Delivery Day is on Tuesday, December 16th. If you are interested in being a driver for the day, we would love to have you! Just let me know. More information about this will be coming home in an email once we get a little closer. :)

7th Grade ELA - "Just keep walking." Salva Dut

We just began our next novel study and unit based on the book <u>Red Scarf Girl.</u> All students are participating in the Doodle for Google contest. Final copies are due by Nov. 25th. We have begun this and the beginnings are looking great! We are working hard on prepositional phrases and their importance in our writing. November Reading Calendars are due 12/1.

**7th Grade Math** - We are currently in chapter 3 and working with percentages and proportions. We will be working extra to emphasize the use of algebra to solve for missing quantities. There is a Math calendar due next Friday. Don't forget these math calendars should be 10 minutes per point and 10 points by completion.

**7th Grade Life Science** - We will be having our Genetics Unit test on Monday. Students have a study guide to help them prepare. They also have an assignment on pedigrees where they will be looking at your traits, as well as other family members, to help them complete this work. We will then be moving onto our learning about DNA. We'll start with the discovery of the DNA structure (one of them just passed away at the age of 97 - James Watson).

**7th Grade Social Studies**- 7th grade has continued learning about the Revolutionary War. They also were able to make posters on different significant figures and groups that were important for the war effort.

### 8th Grade News

**8th Grade Homeroom** - Reminder to sign and return Friday Folders! Also, make sure your student is checking their mailbox so that you can see their graded assignments! Here is the class during technology day:)

8th Grade ELA - We have begun our unit on Shakespeare. We will start with Romeo and Juliet and then branch out into other tragedies as well as comedy and historical. All students are participating in the Doodle for Google contest. Final copies are due by Nov. 25th. We are working hard on prepositional phrases and their importance in our writing. November Reading Calendars are due 12/1.



**8th Grade Math** -This week we are working on Chapter 3 with differentiating between linear and nonlinear functions. Don't forget these math calendars should be 10 minutes per point and 10 points by completion.

**8th Grade Earth Science** - Students need to keep observing the moon so we get a full lunar cycle in. We will finish up our work on the Sun and then we'll be moving onto the Moon. We'll learn all about the Moon's features, misconceptions about the Moon, lunar cycles/phases of the moon, and do a fun survival on the Moon activity.

**8th Grade Social Studies**- 8th grade is now exploring the Roaring 20s and what happened immediately after WWI. We are also diving into Law enforcement in Civics.
